


Creating "Effects" in Photoshop


There are many effects that you can create in Photoshop. Here are some simple ones.


Open your image and crop appropriately - I recommend a simple photograph for this tutorial.

Select the Rectangular Marquee tool and change the Feather to a value of 10 pixels and make a selection similar to the one displayed with rounded corners.



Open the **Effects** palette from the docking bar on the top right of the screen by dragging it down onto your work area. Re-size the palette.





Scroll down until you see the **Vignette** effect.

Ensure the marquee is selected on your image.

Drag the Vignette image onto your image or double mouse click on the Vignette image.

Your photo will change and a **Vignette** feather will be applied.

You will be asked if you want “to keep this effect”.

Click you and save your image with the feathered vignette.



Exploring Other Effects

You can **Undo** the effect or open the image again and make the marquee selection. Place a different effect on your image. Click on “No” when asked if you want to keep the effect and then repeat, trying a variety of different effects, such as Drop Shadow, Brushed Aluminum or Wood Frame.
